## Even Count Tubular Peyote Stitch Tutorial

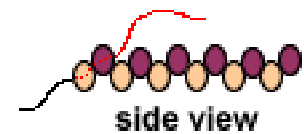
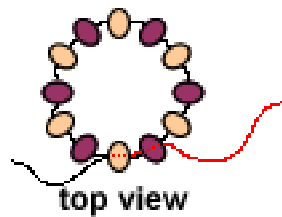
Even Count Tubular Peyote Stitch is a popular stitch for amulet bags. It can be used for almost any cylindrical shaped item such as a pen, lighter cover, bottle, etc. The number of beads in a row determines the size of the piece. It only has to be an even number of beads.

The thread of the beads being sewn on will be represented in red, and trailing end of thread in black.

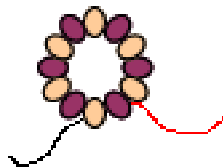
1. String all the beads for rows 1 and 2. (For illustration purposes, we will create a piece that is 6 beads around.)



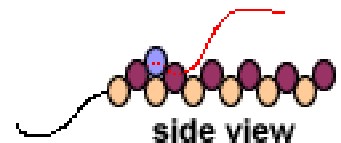
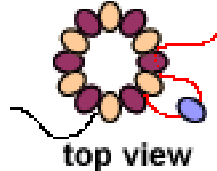
2. Continue through the first 2 beads you placed on your floss, forming a circle.



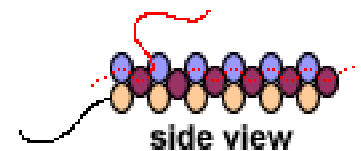
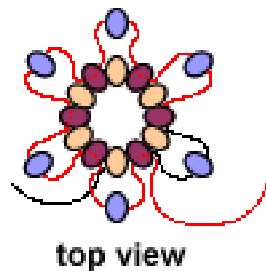
3. Pull your work snug.



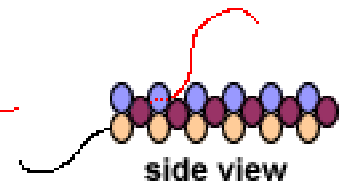
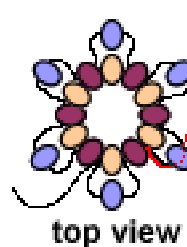
4. Now you will begin to create row 3. Pick up one bead. Skip a bead on your original circle and go through the following bead. Pull your work snug. (For illustration purposes, view 1 is not pulled snug.)



5. Continue this pattern until you have gone through the first bead again in your 2<sup>nd</sup> row.



6. Now you will 'step up' by going through the first bead in row 3.



7. Continue steps 4 through 6 for successive rows until you have completed your piece.
